SUMMARIES OF

ONTARIO (AMISH) MENNONITE FAMILIES

The purpose of these summaries is to alert researchers to the families residing in or originating in Ontario, Canada and where to find genealogical information.

Where genealogies have been published, these are indicated. In other cases, I have additional information—sometimes a great deal and other times very little. Where I have very little, I usually indicate this. If anyone is working on families which tie into any of these, I shall be very happy to know about it and to exchange information. Where I know other people have more information on a particular family than I do, I give them as a reference.

Baechler, Christian (1827-1918) m. 1852 to Barbara Oesch (1829-1909) dau. of Bishop John Oesch and Barbara Schultz

Christian came to Canada as a single man and the only member of his family-- perhaps an orphan.

His genealogy is found in John and Barbara (Schultz) Oesch Family History and Genealogy, 1969.

Baechler, Joseph (1817-1891) was ordained minister in France. m. Catherine Steinman (1824-1908)

Joseph and his family came to Tavistock, Ontario in 1852.

ALBRECHT

Albrecht, George (1832-1924)

George, a Lutheran, came from Bavaria in the early 1840's to avoid the draft. He and his brother came as stow-aways on a cattle boat. In America the two brothers were separated, and George never heard of his brother (name now unknown) again. George came to Canada.

George m. Elizabeth Bauer (? -1855) in 1854 George rm. Maria Hammer (? - 1900) in 1856

George and his family were members of the Amish Mennonite Church.

The George Albrecht Genealogy was compiled by Amos and Nancy Albrecht, Brunner, Ontario in 1878

Albrecht, John (ca.1800- ?)

John m. Barbara (ca.1806- ?)

John and Barbara had at least two sons.

Jacob Albrecht (? -?)

m. to Anna Kennel (1837-1910)

dau. of Christian Kennel and Magdalena Jantzi Anna rm. to Jacob Christner and resided in Pigeon, Michigan where a number of her children also settled.

Henry Albrecht (1840-?)

m. 1860 to Mary Stever (ca. 1843-?)

dau. of John and Wilhelmina Stever

Henry and Mary had 11 children. Most of their descendants are in Ontario, Canada.

Albrecht, Magdalena (1833-1918)

m. 1851 to Christian E. Kennel (1827-1908)

son of Christian Kennel and Magdalena Jantzi Magdalena may be a sister to the above Jacob and Henry. The Kennels lived at Wellesley, Ont.

BASINGER BESSINGER ETC.

Below is a listing of Basingers found in the Waterloo County census records. I do not know which ones belong to the Pennsylvania Mennonite and which ones belong to the Amish Mennonites. I am not aware that the name exists in the area todya. The Lichti family listed at the bottom of the page is very numerous, and most of them live in the area.

On Apr. 13, 1862 the same parties, the same property to Christian Gingerich. (Christian Gingerich's wife was probably the widow of John Miller)

BELLAR (Beller)

An Andrew Bellar family appears for the first time in Canada in the 1861 census.

There are connections between Bellars in Lewis County, New York, in Ontario, Canada and in Nebraska, but not much research has been done in Ontario.

BENDER

Bender, Christian appears in the Amish Mennonite settlement in an 1830 survey. Nothing further is known concerning this family.

Bender, Jacob (? - 1843) m. Magdalena Brenneman (1798-1877) migrated from Hesse, Germany in 1831 and arrived in Canada in 1832.

This family is found in the Genealogy of Jacob and Magdalena Bender Record of Descendants until the Year of our Lord 1946, Third edition by Jacob R. Bender, Tavistock, Ontario

Bender, John D. (1824-1896)

It is not known who Barbara's parents were, nor where she was born.

BOSHART

The following 3 Boshart brothers were sons of John Boshart and Anna Maria Müller:

Boshart, Christian (1786-1850) born in Tagsdorf, France m. 1813 to Catherine Litwiller (1786-1873) born in Staffelfelden, France dau. of Jacob Litwiller and Maria Müree came to Canada in about 1826.

Boshart, John (1788 - ?) born in Wittelsheim, France m. 1818 to Marie Eicker (1788-1850) born near Belfort, France dau. of John Eicker and Anna Hostetler John died in France. The widow and her 5 children came to Canada in 1834.

Boshart, Joseph (1790-1866) born in France
m. 1823 to Catherine Conrad (1797-1869) born at Belfort, France
dau. of _____ Conrad and Elizabeth Schlegel
came to Canada in 1838 or 39.

More details on the Boshart family are found in the <u>Christian and Catherine (Buerge)</u> Boshart Family History and Genealogy, compiled by Mrs. Fred Carr, Lorraine Roth and Mrs. Merrill Boshart, 1978.

BRENNEMAN

Brenneman, John Sr. (?-?)

John Brenneman Sr. was ordained a minister in the Amish Mennonite congregation in Wilmot, Ontario, Canada in 1824. He resided at Lot 13, Bleams Rd. S in Wilmot Township.

An attached sheet outlines the family of John Brenneman. This is the only Brenneman family found in Ontario, Canada.

On page 857 of The Brenneman History by Albert H. Gerberich. (Scottdale, Pa.: Mennonite Publishing House) 1938 is found a Johannes Brenneman, son of Nicholas, born Mar. 30, 1766. Other descendants of Nicholas knew of and visited relatives in Canada; so it is quite likely that John belongs to this family. On pages 932 and 933 (Nos. 4 and 5) are an incorrect conglomerate of the Canadian Brennemans. On page 916 a Jacob and Daniel Brenneman are mentioned. They are to have died in Canada. I am not able to identify them.

BRUNK

Brunk, Peter (ca.1812 - 1895) born in France m. Catherine Ernst (ca.182 - 1886)

In the census Peter is listed as Catholic, Catherine and the children as Mennonite. (15 children)

BUERGE

Jacob Buerge was born in Bern, Switzerland (probably the canton of Bern, rather than the city) on Feb. 14, 1785. He and two of his brothers were orphaned. One brother remained in Switzerland. Jacob and his brother Peter came to America. On the trip Jacob met Elizabeth Grieser (or Greaser) from Alsace-Lorraine and married her about 1825. Jacob had lived in Lancaster, Pennsylvania for some time but must have joined the migration of Amish Mennonites who went to Canada in 1824 and the years following. Their oldest daughter Catherine was born in Canada in 1826. She was among the first white children to be born in the area.

Jacob and Elizabeth settled on Lot 21 North Bleams Rd. This farm is now on the eastern side of the town of New Hamburg. The family of Jacob and Elizabeth was as follows:

Jacob died Apr. 1, 1862 and is buried in the Community Cemetery on Bleams Rd. about three miles east of the Buerge farm. Jacob had named his son-in-law, Christian E. Boshart as one of his executors.

A number of members of the Buerge family moved to Michigan and joined the Church of God in Christ Mennonites. In fact, they all may have done so except the Bosharts.

Most of the above information is from records preserved by Claude Buerge.

It seems this family has consistently retained the above spelling of the name Buerge.

CHRISTNER

Christner, Peter (ca.1798 - ?) m. Veronica _____ (ca.1805 - ?)

Peter and Fany lived on Lot 35 $W_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$, Conc. 15 East Zorra Twp. (east of Tavistock). About 1855 they probably migrated to the United States

Their children in the 1851 census record were as follows:

The descendants of Magdalena appear in The Wagler Family History by Jerome Raber and Joseph Stoll

Christner, Christian (? - 1836) came to Canada about 1828 m. Elizabeth or Katie

Christian, a resident of Wilmot Twp. near Baden, Ont. seems to have died an accidental death. The widow and children migrated at various times and to different places in the United States.

Christner, John is found on Lot 2 N Bleams Rd in Wilmot Township in 1830.

This family was probably part of the Pennsylvania Mennonite settlement.

Christners in the area today are probably descended from this family.

Ebersol, Christian (ca. 1787-) from France m. Susanna Zwally (? -1849) (ca.1801rm. Magdalena) from France Christian Ebersol and his second wife appear on lots 23 and 24 in Wilmot, Snyders Rd. N. in 1851 and 61. In 1862 Christian Ebersol, Jr. signed the probate of the will of Christian Sr. In 1863 the widow sold the land. Probably the family went to Pennsylvania. Ebersol, John (1874m. Laura Miller rm. Mattie Schmidt John was a grandson of Christian Ebersol, Jr. After the death of his

first wife he came to Canada, married Mattie Schmidt and remained here.

EGLI (EGLY)

Egli, John (1821-1907) born on the Mondels Hof near Ellingen in Baden, Germany m. in 1850 to Magdalena Gascho (1826-1902) born in Bavaria

John was raised in Strasburg, Alsace and came to Canada in 1847. He married Magdalena Gascho, dau. of Joseph Gascho and Magdalena Ingold. They lived in East Zorra Township (near Tavistock) Ontario. In the 1850's they moved to Huron County (Zurich). John was ordained deacon or minister in the Blake Amish Mennonite congregation. They moved to Tazewell County, Illinois in 1867. They had 12 children. (from the death notice of John Egli and other sources)

On July 3, 1845 he affirmed allegiance, residing in Wilmot, after 7 years in Canada. Joseph appeared in Wellesley, as a widower, in the 1851 census. Elizabeth was a servant in the home. Maria was with them. In the 1861 and 1871 census, they were living on Lot #3, Conc. III. In 1872 Joseph built a permanent house on this farm. The Reformed Mennonite Church built a church and established a cemetery on the southwest corner of this farm. Joseph's family joined this church. In March of 1877 they moved to Nebraska.

The parents of Joseph Megli were François Joseph Moeglin and Catherine Boshart They were married on Sept. 11, 1817. François Joseph died, at age 68, on Dec. 1, 1817. Catherine, age 33, gave birth to Joseph on Mar 19, 1818. Catherine was the daughter of Jean Bossard, weaver, Anabaptist, deceased, and Anne Marie Müller. Catherine was born Nov. 25, 1784 at Geischausson near Belfort, and is to have died in 1821.

STEINMAN FAMILY HISTORY

Christian Steinman, patriarch of this family was born in 1792. He was a baker by trade. Christian, his wife Veronica Oyer (Eier) and oldest son Christian, left Bavaria in 1826 and came to Wilmot Township with the Christian Nafziger family.

When we think about the reason or reasons for the migration to Canada, history tells us of the religious persecutions they suffered in Europe. The Napoleonic wars were on at that time and because of their nonresistance stance, the Mennonites chose to migrate for religious freedom. Christian had been ordained a minister in Bavaria and became one of the early leaders in the Wilmot congregation (now Steinmanns and St. Agatha).

Christian Steinman settled on Lot 18 N Snyder's Rd. Today we may chuckle a bit or be very surprised that there was opposition toward fire insurance. Christian Steinman, a minister in the church, had taken out fire insurance on his buildings in the 1840's. He was reprimanded for this action as insurance of any kind was frowned upon. He was a man ahead of his time.

Christian also came to own the front part of Lot 18 S Snyder's Rd. Son Daniel was to have the lot on the north side of the road while son Christian had purchased the remainder of the lot on the south side. However, the north lot contained much cedar swamp; so Christian Sr. stipulated in his will that Daniel was to have the two morthernmost fields of the south lot while Christian Jr. was to have his share of the cedar swamp; so he would have an ample supply of cedar posts and rails.

Christian and Veronica are buried at the northwest corner of Lot 18 S. This burial plot has now become the cemetery of the Steinmann Mennonite Church.
